Exhibits not accepted will be placed on a list to be considered for the 2025 Pennsylvania Maple Festival.

Please read the Rules and Regulations governing the Maple Festival Fair and if there are any questions, please call the Maple Festival Office (814-634-0213) or Maddie Johnson (814-279-8967) for assistance.

The Maple Festival Board can not deviate from the Rules and Regulations. The Rules and Regulations are based upon the "State Premium Guideline Book" published by the Agriculture Fair Program, Department of Agriculture, and Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. A copy is available for review in the Maple Festival Office. Entries in the Premium List are the only ones that can be judged. Entries not complying will be rejected, regardless of merit. However, items for exhibition only will be accepted. In cases where there is no competition, judges may give an award such as they deem the exhibit worthy to receive. All judging is final and closed to the public.

All exhibits must be made or grown by the exhibitor during the time period since the last Pennsylvania Maple Festival and must be entered in the name of the person making or producing the exhibit.

Reasonable care will be taken to protect all exhibits on display from all injury and damage. But the Maple Festival is not, in any way, responsible for accidents, loss or damage by water, fire, theft, or otherwise, what ever may be the cause or extent of the damage or loss. All articles on exhibition must be respected as private property and any persons detected destroying them or injuring them will be dealt with according to law.

The exhibits will be open to the public on **April 20 & 21 and April 24 – 28, 2024.** Exhibits will located in the Craft Building in the Festival Park Complex, Meyersdale Fire Department Social Hall, Main Street, and in the windows of the Borough businesses. Exhibits must be available for display until the closing of the Festival on **April 30, 2024**. Pick up of the exhibits will begin from 5:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. on **April 29 and 30, 2024**. There will be no exceptions.

The Horse Pulling Contest (Department 1, Horses) will be held **Sunday**, **April 28, 2024**, at 1:00 pm at the Somerset County Fair Grounds.

For Departments 8, Eggs; 11, 4-H and Vocational and Youth under 19; 12, Hay and Grain; 13, Vegetables; 14, Fruit and Nuts; 15, Section 2 – Canned Products; 17, Floral Exhibits; 18, Needlecraft; 19, Art-Photography-Crafts; and 21, Wine and Beer, exhibits will be accepted Saturday, April 13, 2024, from 10:00 a.m. until 3:00 p.m. and Monday, April 15, 2024, from 6:00 p.m. until 9:00 p.m. in the Craft Building in the Festival Park Complex. Judging will be conducted April 15 through 18, 2024, which is closed to the public.

Quilt Show entries will be accepted Saturday, April 13, 2024, from 10:00 a.m. until 3:00 p.m. at the Meyersdale Fire Hall Social Hall. Alternate dates and places for registration will be Tuesday, April 9, 2024, from 11:00 a.m. until 2:00 p.m. at St. Paul's United Church of Christ, 202 West Union Street, Somerset, PA 15501, as well as Wednesday, April 10, 2024, at The Sewing Box Quilt Shop, 144 Eleventh Avenue, Meyersdale, PA 15552. Pre-Registration – scan and e-mail "a copy" to pamaple@verizon.net by April 15, 2024, or mail "a copy" of the form to PA Maple Festival, 120 Meyers Avenue, PO Box 22, Meyersdale, PA 15552. ## **Department 13 - Vegetables**

- In selecting vegetables for exhibition, choose such specimens that would bring the highest market prices.
- Do not select the largest; select medium size specimens.
- Avoid mixing vegetables.
- Read premium material. Carefully follow all rules and regulations. If and entry calls for five specimens, exhibit that number; do not enter four or six. Your exhibit will be disqualified for having a number of specimens other than that stipulated.
- These factors are generally used by an expert vegetable judge:
  - O Trueness to variety type. Pick the specimens from one variety.
  - O Uniformity in size, shape and color.
  - Pick out a perfect specimen; then select others as similar to it as possible. Never mix specimens or varying maturities.
  - Protect from dirt, disease, infection and mechanical damage. Select specimens that are perfect and show no blemishes of any kind.
  - O Condition and maturity. Be sure exhibits are of high quality.
  - O Potatoes should not be washed. Remove soil using a soft cloth or brush.
  - Tomatoes should have stems removed. Carrots, beets, etc. should have tops (leaves) removed leaving about two inches of stems.

- Ten specimens of each variety are to be entered. Specimens must be displayed on a plate.

- Flowers or plants entered for competition must be of more than ordinary standard and quality to be entitled to an award.
- All entries must have been grown by exhibitors, except for those in arrangement classes.

- Judging is performed by the Penn State Forest Resources Department. Judging is closed to the public; only judges and committee members are permitted in the exhibit area during judging.
- Competing entries of 100% pure maple products shall be produced or made in Somerset County, PA (or by a member of the Somerset County Maple Producers Association), by the exhibitor in the current season (only exception is Category 10, Gift Pack, which allows for additional added-value products not limited to "made in Somerset County").
- No entry fee will be charged, and no charge will be made for display space.
- No exhibitor may enter more than one exhibit in any single class. Prizes will be awarded for first through fifth places, but only first, second, and third will be made public. Fourth and fifth place will be awarded discreetly.
- All exhibits shall remain the property of the exhibitor, providing same are claimed after 5:00 p.m., Sunday, April 28, 2024, at Maple Festival Park.
- No premium will be awarded in any class unless the exhibits are worthy. (The judge may withhold any premium for lack of merit.)
